Eighth Annual Saint John Christmas Bird Count

Date: Saturday, January 2, 1965.

Area: A 15-mile diameter circle centred newr Milledgeville, including Woodman's Point, Westfield, Grand Bay, Lancaster, Saint John, East Saint John, Anthony's Cove, Lakewood, Golden Grove, Rothesay, and a large portion of the Kingston Peninsula south and west of Moss Glen.

The object: To compile a list of the number of individual birds of each species seen on the count day from as complete a coverage of the area as possible by observers in the field and by persons watching their bird feeders.

Observers: The only portion of the area that is relatively intensively covered is a portion of Rothesay and East Riverside. We are eager to obtain new participants from any place in the area. We welcome both stay-at-home feeder watchers and outdoor hikers. If each former participant would interest someone new we would make quite a stride forward towards complete coverage of the area. All that is required is recording of the number of birds of each species that you see on Jan. 2.

Persons whose names are on the accompanying list will be contacted for their results on the evening of Jan. 2. If you plan to take part and your name is not listed or you have obtained a new participant please call one of the compilers or Dr. W.A. Squires (693-1196).

Change in organization: In order to quickly collect the data from a, hopefully, increasing number of observers, the area has been subdivided into six districts. Mrs. V.B. Watters and Henrik Deichmann will be assistant compilers, each responsible for two districts.

This year promises to be one of little variety so we will probably need all the reports we can get in order to keep ahead of the species totals in Moncton and St. Andrews. You may have at your feeder the only Song Sparrow or the only Purple Finch that will be seen. In the past the species total has varied from a low of 24 in 1958 to a high of 52 in 1961 and we have alternated between good years and bad years. Last year was good, so if the trend continues this year will be bad. Possibly we can break the even-numbered jinx this year with an increased force of observers.
