Hello all Christmas Bird Counters,

The latest edition of the Saint John Christmas Bird Count took place on 27 Dec 2014, a day that will go down in history as clear, calm and unusually mild. (I think I predicted that over a year ago.) No snow on the ground, or ice in the rivers or streams.

We had 60 participants on the count this year. There were 35 people in the field, plus 8 more who observed both in the field and at their feeders. Another 17 people watched feeders and sent in reports. (One feeder had two observers.) That makes 24 feeders in all.

Despite the good weather, the species total of 65 this year was a little below the average of previous 8 years, 67.4 species. Number of individuals, 11680, was also below the 8 year average of 13644.25.

Below the signature line, I've written up a brief summary of my impressions of results this year, and how they compare to previous years. At the very bottom of this e-mail is a list of species with their count totals. I added this list in the body of the e-mail because I understand some e-mail recipients can't open attachments. I don't know if format will follow to its final destination. It looks perfect on my computer.

As an attachment, there is a spreadsheet covering the totals for the last 9 years, the years for which I've been compiler and have the data at hand. Interesting to compare what we found year to year.

Next year Christmas day falls on a Friday. I expect not many would want to head out on a Christmas Bird Count on Saturday, 26 Dec, the day following Christmas day. So, I'm proposing that next year, the Saint John Christmas Bird count be scheduled for Sunday, 27 Dec, 2015. Any comments on that, of other suggestions would be welcome.

ps - it's not too late to send in any Count Period additions. I know some people are saving them till the end of count period (Jan 5). I can make adjustments if something new needs to be added or changed.

pps - please excuse any mistakes. I know there will be a few missed in proofreading. These I usually catch almost immediately after clicking 'SEND'.

Some general impressions of the Count follows....

Ducks and other water birds:

Most of the expected waterfowl this year, but generally lower numbers. Unusual by its absence was Hooded Merganser. Fewer Common and Red-breasted Mergansers this year, too. No Barrow's Goldeneye, and Common Goldeneye numbers were reduced. Lots of Bufflehead. No Scoters. The lower numbers of Black Ducks and Mallards this year probably reflects the amount of open water still available throughout the region; they haven't been forced to the coast by frozen ponds and lagoons. We usually get some rare-in-winter ducks on the count; this year the award goes to American Wigeon, a species not recorded since 2006.

Grouse:

Just 7 Ruffed Grouse this year. About average. No Spruce Grouse.

Hawks and Owls:

An early morning Snowy Owl at the container terminal on the west side was the only owl. The number of late-leaving or over-wintering Turkey Vultures continues to climb; 11 this year. The 26 Bald Eagles this year was about half of the 53 counted last year. (The ice storm last year may have concentrated the Eagles at the landfill with an amazing 45 there alone). No Harrier this year, but both Red-tailed and Rough-legged Hawks were observed.

No Goshawk, but both Cooper's and Sharp-shinned. A single Merlin was the only definite falcon.

Herons and Coots:

No Herons, not even a Great Blue Heron for the Count Period. But the first time in 9 years, 2 Coots on Count Day. (Coots previously made it into Count Period.)

Gulls, Shorebirds, and Alcids:

No Alcids or Shorebirds this year. Even with the open conditions, no Snipe were reported. The usual Gull species: Herring, Iceland, Ring-billed, and Great Black-backed. The numbers vary widely from year to year. No surprise, most of the Herring were at the landfill. No other Gulls turned up this year.

Doves and Woodpeckers:

An average year for both groups. About average counts for both Rock Pigeons and Mourning Doves (despite several comments about the lack of Mourning Doves at feeders. All 3 expected Woodpeckers (Downy, Hairy, Pileated), plus one each of Red-bellied and Flicker.

Shrikes:

Just one Northern Shrike. We seem to get at least one most years.

Corvids:

Gray Jays made it into the count with 4 this year; we don't always get this species. Fewer Blue Jays around to be counted, perhaps still in the woods enjoying natural food. The Blue Jays may come back to feeders when real winter arrives. Always lots of Crows, this year was no exception. Fewer Ravens

overall, especially noticeable at the landfill.

Chickadees, Nuthatches, Wrens, Creepers, and Kinglets:

An average year for Black-capped Chickadees. We were fortunate to have 2 Boreal Chickadees make it on the count; we don't always get Boreal. A banner year for Nuthatches; 64 Red-breasted (highest in 9 years) and 14 White-breasted (tied for highest). A single secretive Carolina Wren allowed itself to be seen on count day. An average number of Golden-crowned, but no Ruby-crowned Kinglets.

Thrushes, Mockingbird, Starling, and Waxwings:

Only 5 Robins (compared to 342 last year). No other Thrushes. We always seem to get Mockingbirds hanging on for the Count; this year no exception with 2. Only 1135 Starlings, the lowest number in 9 years. Not a single Waxwing, even in Count Period.

Warblers:

Not a single warbler. No reports for Count Period, either.

Sparrows and other finches:

The usual Sparrow species (Tree, Song, White-throated, Junco) in average numbers. None of the rarer species reported this year. Unusual in that no Longspur or Snow Bunting this year, either. After generally increasing since 2006, Cardinal numbers took a dip, down to 45 this year.

Blackbirds:

The only report of Blackbirds was of 6 Grackles coming to a feeder.

The 'winter' Finches:

A Pine Grosbeak in Count Period. Both Purple and House Finch on the count (small numbers). No Crossbills or Redpolls on Count Day, but a single Common Redpoll for Count week. A single Pine Siskin visiting a feeder, the same feeder that was hosting 16 of the 17 Evening Grosbeaks. American Goldfinch numbers were low this year, just 168; usually they are 300+ range.

Finally:

House Sparrow. Just 33 reported, one of the lowest counts ever. But I think there are many more around Saint John that go undetected on Count Day.
